Begin preparing your application, including portfolio, for submission to the RI Certification Board

If you have already taken a Community Health Worker core competency training and want guidance on applying for CHW certification in RI, this workshop is for you! This free virtual workshop will give advice about preparing your portfolio. Please note: CHWARI does not provide the certification itself; the RI Certification Board does. This workshop will provide basic guidance but will refer you to the RICB for more complex questions.

Certification (or a plan with your employer to get it) is necessary for getting Medicaid reimbursement for your CHW services, so register today!

This workshop is open to those who:

- Have completed 70 hours of Core Competency CHW Training, or who are currently enrolled in a training program that will result in meeting that requirement (having applied for such a training does not count)
- Are employed as CHWs
- Will fulfill the 1000 CHW work hours required within the next two months
